SKIPPING COMPETITION

Teams from Birchills, Reedswood, Barcroft and St. Giles demonstrated their skipping skills in a Skipping Competition at the Academy on Thursday, 30th November. Children were set a task of completing the following disciplines in 30 secs and their scores were recorded by Academy Sports Leaders: Double Jumps - Backwards on two feet; Single Jumps - Forward on two feet; Boxer Skips - Alternate feet; Scissors - One foot in front, one foot behind; Hop-hop-hop - Three hops on one foot, three hops on the other; Feet apart - Feet together and Pairs - Pupils facing each other.

Individual Placings were: First: Elisiah - Reedswood - 476 skips; Second: Malakya - Birchills - 335 skips; Third: Gracie - St. Giles - 319 skips.

Team Results were: First, St. Giles- 1682 skips; Second, Reedswood - 1676 skips; Third, Birchill's "A" - 1143 skips; Fourth, Birchills "C" - 1115 skips Fifth, Birchill's "B" - 969 skips; Sixth, Barcroft "A"—732 skips; Seventh—St. Giles "B"- 705; Eighth , Barcroft "B"—695 skips.



SCHOOL GAMES MARK

What is the School Games Mark?

The School Games Mark is a Government led awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community. Schools in England are able to assess themselves across bronze, silver and gold levels.

The Mark is a retrospective award which validates the schools' success over the academic year.

Prerequisites:

Participation

1. A system in place to track young people's participation in the School Games;
2. Opportunities that attract less active young people to participate in physical activity;

Competition:

1. Hold a School Games Day as the culmination of a year-round competition programme;
2. A calendar of competition that demonstrates opportunities for young people with SEND to take part in competitions;
3. A notice board promoting School Games activity.
